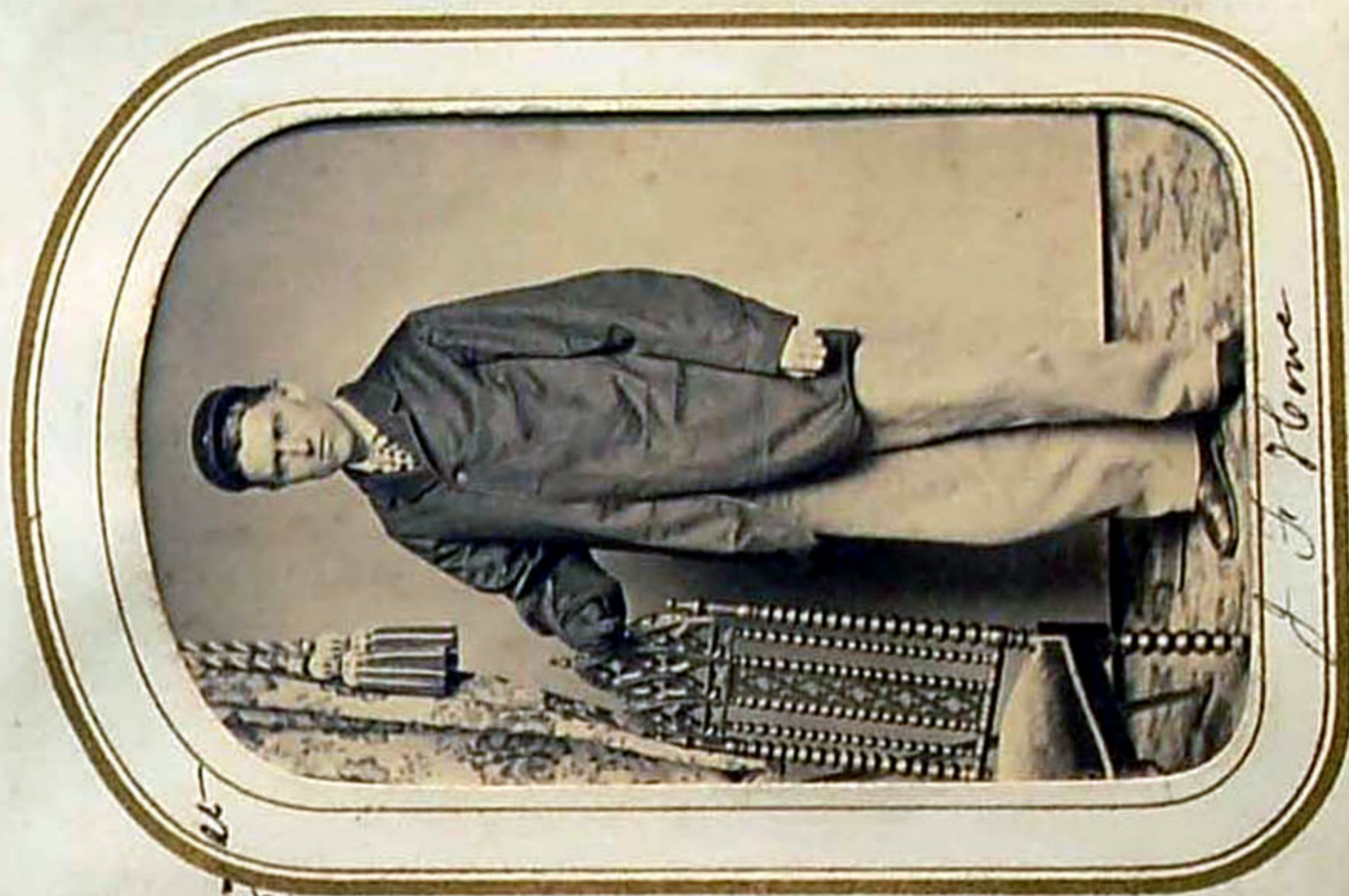
In the years of 1864 and 1865

The Fortifications upon these heights up to the time of the evacuation of Richmond, were of the most formidable character, and effectually barred all approach by water to the City of Richmond.

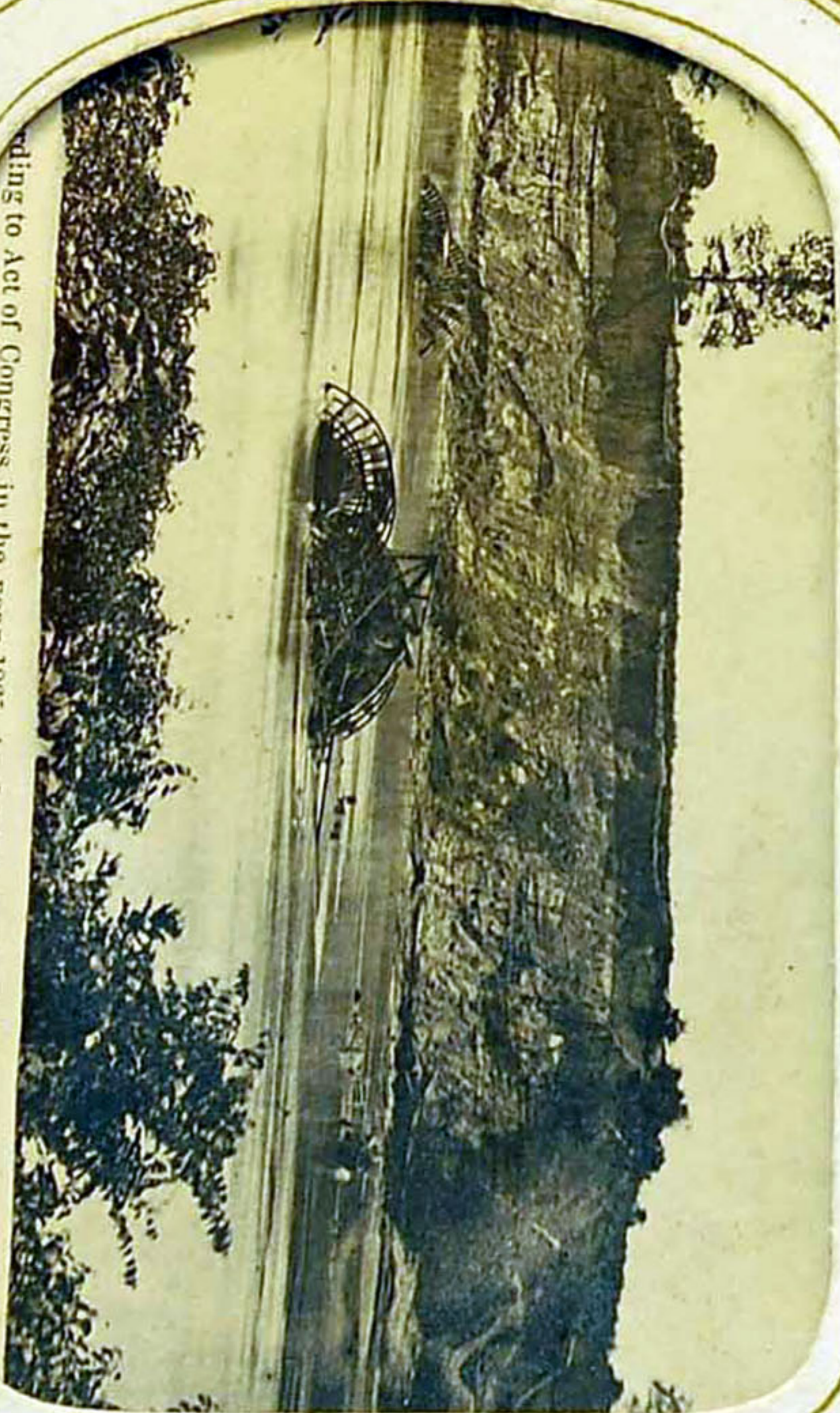

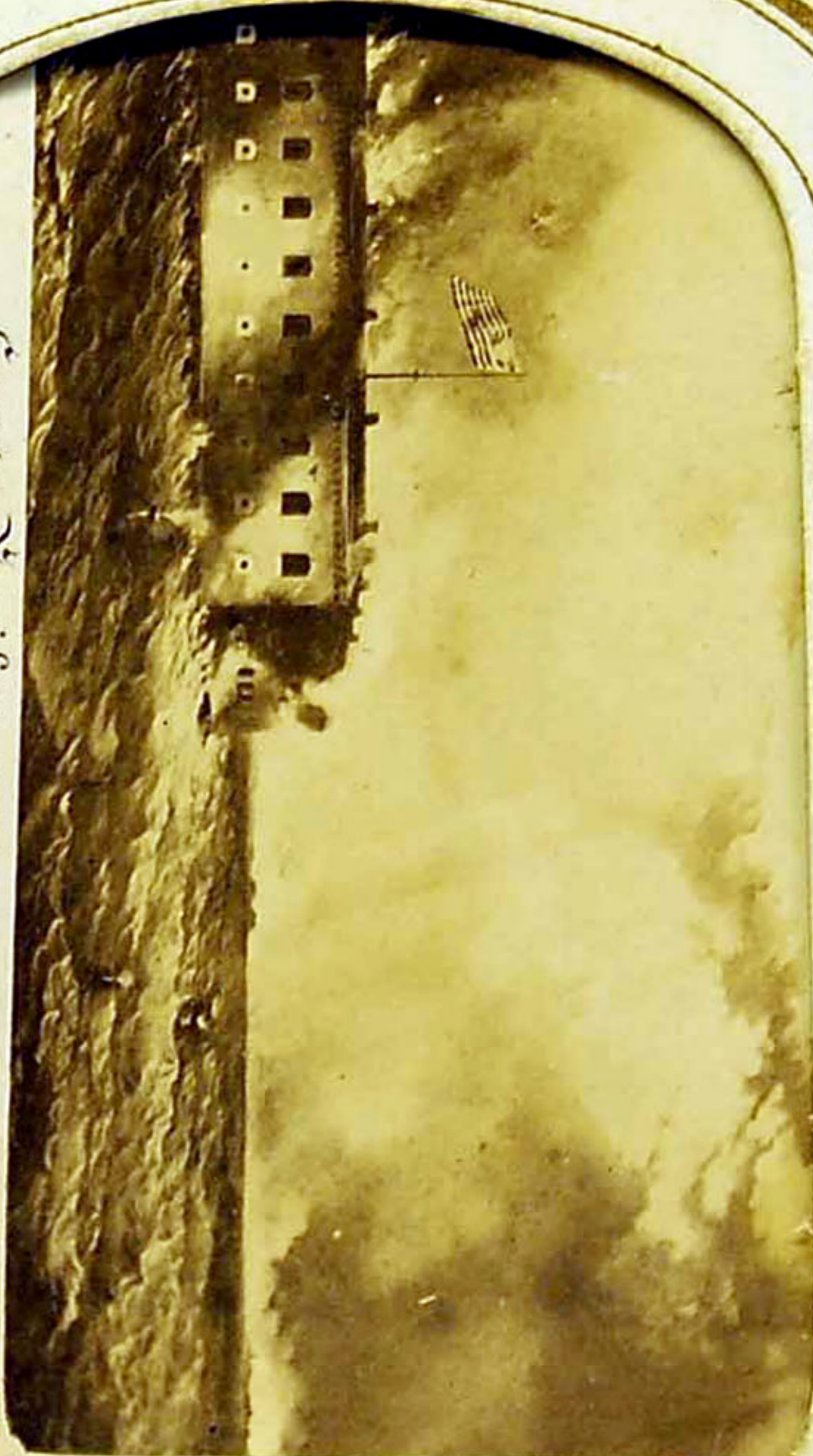
